Throughout the week, you will have an exciting opportunity to explore bold solutions on a range of urban topics, from using water resources and buildings more efficiently to reimagining climate-resilient communities and the post-2030 agenda. This is also a unique chance to help shape a strong call for action to convey to the OECD Ministerial Meeting on Regional Development Policy in Warsaw, Poland, on 19-20 May 2025.

### Cities for Peace April, 16th - The Program

### About the event

On Wednesday, April 16, a Peace Conference will be held at the Hôtel de Ville in Paris, organized by the City of Paris and the French association Les Guerrières de la Paix, which has been nominated for the 2025 Nobel Peace Prize. This event, part of a long tradition of city-led peace initiatives, aims to bring together Israeli and Palestinian peace activists alongside mayors from all over the world.

The conference will feature an afternoon of testimonies and public discussions, highlighting concrete solutions and dedicating a special focus to the role of women in conflict resolution. This gathering seeks to foster collective reflection on the challenges facing the Middle East and to determine how cities can best contribute to the restoration of peace in this region, which has been fractured by decades of violence and destruction, escalating dramatically since October 7, 2023.

At the conclusion of the conference, a movement (or campaign) will be launched, inviting participating mayors to endorse a commitment document proposed by the activists, symbolizing their dedication to peace efforts.
