Fyrirhuguð þátttaka borgarstjóra í CDP Europe Awards í París, Frakklandi, 25. febrúar 2020

Fyrirhuguð er þátttaka borgarstjóra í verðlaunaathöfn CDP (áður Carbon Disclosure Project), CDP Europe Awards, sem fram fer í Evrópu- og utanríkisráðuneyti Frakklands í París þriðjudaginn 25. febrúar 2020. Á viðburðinum koma saman fyrirtæki, fjárfestar og stjórnmálaleiðtogar, fulltrúar borga og ríkisvalds, til að ræða hvernig ná megi sameiginlegum markmiðum Evrópubúa í umhverfismálum. Borgarstjóri mun taka þátt í umræðum og taka við viðurkenningu CDP en borgin hefur komist á svokallaðan A-lista. Á þeim lista eru þær borgir sem skora hátt í aðgerðum gegn loftslagsbreytingum en aðeins 7% þeirra 600 borga sem taka þátt, fá slíka einkunn. Með borgarstjóra í för verður aðstoðarmaður hans, Pétur Krogh Ólafsson.

CDP: Loftslagsbókhald og Evrópuverðlaun CDP

Almennt um CDP

CDP (áður þekkt sem Carbon Disclosure Project) er óhagnaðardrifin samtök sem starfa um allan heim, með höfuðstöðvar í London og Evrópuskrifstofu í Berlín. Samtökin þjóna sem gagnaveita er veitir upplýsingar um loftslagsbókhald gerenda sem eru óháðir ríkjum (e. non-state actors), svo sem fjárfesta, fyrirtækja, borga og héraða. Upplýsingarnar varða bæði mótvægisaðgerðir og aðlögun að loftslagsbreytingum (e. mitigation & adaptation) en taka einnig á ýmsum atriðum tengdum sjálfbærni s.s. matarstefnu og auðlindanotkun (s.s. vatnsnotkun). Samtökin eiga í samstarfi við samtök á borð við *C40, ICLEI , Carbonn, WWF, Global Covenant of Mayors* og *Carbon Neutral Cities Alliance.* Pau taka við og halda utan um loftslagsbókhald aðildarfélaga, halda reglulega fundi og halda kynningar. Hlutverk samtakanna er einnig að gefa þeim aðilum sem gera upp loftslagsbókhald sitt einkunn (e. score) og veita ráðgjöf um hvernig hægt er að gera enn betur í baráttunni við loftslagsvá. Þjónusta samtakanna er borgum að kostnaðarlausu en þau rukka fyrirtæki og fjárfesta og njóta ýmissa styrkja frá einkaaðilum, góðgerðarsamtökum og opinberum aðilum, m.a. frá Evrópusambandinu. Evrópuverðlaun CDP

Evrópuverðlaun CDP fara í ár fram í Evrópu- og utanríkisráðuneyti Frakklands í París þann 25. febrúar 2020. Á verðlaununum koma saman um 250 aðilar víða að úr heiminum frá a.mk. 50 borgum og munu um 10 ræðumenn taka þátt í umræðum sem standa í um fjórar klukkustundir, borgarstjórinn í Reykjavík þar á meðal. Reykjavíkurborg fékk hæstu einkunn CDP (A-list) bæði fyrir árin 2018 og 2019 en frétt um einkunnina árið 2019 má sjá á vefsvæði Reykjavíkurborgar:




City of Reykjavík CDP Cities 2019
